EIGHTY-six participants composed of student leaders from various parts of the country, together with their advisers and chaplains, convened for the Student Catholic Action of the Philippines (SCAP) 12th National Leadership Conference last Oct. 25 to 29 to delve deeper into the "power of small communities" as well as on the realities of today's digital natives.

The Student Catholic Action (SCA) local chapter of Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary Parish in Lopez, Quezon Province (Diocese of Gumaca) hosted the delegates for the five-day study session which carries the theme "Offline is Online: Transforming today's Youth through Faith Communities."

The event managed to train and to form SCA student leaders to appraise how they live in today's rapid digital culture and its accompanying challenges and effects. Furthermore, participants reflected on the social teachings of the Church in the context of the digital age, as well as identify necessary leadership tools to face prevailing sociocultural issues.

They reflected and shared relevant experiences with fellow participants about the world they live in and concretely differentiating what is virtual and non-virtual. In the end, they gathered multi-faceted outputs from the experiences of the youth today.

At the end of this activity, students created a working plan in their cells and unit by using techniques for sustaining high school membership and involvement in SCA."

Jonathan Reginales enabled participants to propose simple yet big impact projects that can be done within the campus and surrounding communities. He introduced strategies in mobilizing community projects from SCA cells. The session ended with a personal and group plan of action.

SKILLS WORKSHOPS

Participants learned how to use Catholic apps in the digital world and to share these in small groups or their communities. Responsible use of new media applications was reflected upon. The workshop concluded by creating a contract to self as a Catholic youth in the digital world.

Atty. Aparece introduced useful tools based on the Alternatives to Violence Project on how SCA animators will be able to accompany students in their respective units and to encourage student involvement in the movement in fun, engaging and meaningful ways.

- 2017-4: A resolution for the National Formation Team to revisit the formation track of the High School and College members to review its developmental appropriateness and needs.
- 2017-5: A resolution authorizing the National Formation Team to look into the formation entry process of High School SCAns to the College Units subject for study and review of the NCC or Conference.
- 2017-6: A resolution authorizing the SCAP
 National Secretariat to form a special group to
 help revive the northern Luzon cluster before
 the 2017 SCA National Leadership Conference.
- 2017-7: A resolution asking the National Secretariat to publish an official Membership Directory of Units by September 2017.
- 2017-9: A resolution authorizing the National Secretariate to increase the schedule of fees of Bahay SCAn in consultation with the financial experts of the movement.


- 2017-10: A resolution mandating the National Secretariat to assertively collect the membership fees of the movement and for the NCC to actively assist in this endeavor.
- 2017-11: A resolution for the National Formation Team to craft a formation program specifically designed for its Senior High School members.
- 2017-12: A resolution recognizing the organization of SCAP Senior High School units.
- 2017-13: A resolution requesting the national secretariat to design and conduct a National Cell Leaders Training and Formation
- 2017-14: A resolution mandating the national secretariat to create needs assessment tool for dioceses
- 2017-15: A resolution mandating all units to submit mid-year reports to the diocesan level for an organized and systematic profiling.
- 2017-16: A resolution mandating SCA memberdioceses to revive cluster coordination through diocesan visits and immersion.
- 2017-17: A resolution asking the National Secretariat to update the member arch/diocesan database annually containing essential information
- 2017-18: A resolution asking the National Secretariat to assist the Diocese of Tandag in acquiring endorsement from DepEd


